
#### **North Country Scenic Byway Council Accomplishments**

- Assessment of land use changes along North Country byways
- Documentation of need for better access to historical markers
- Development of digital maps of North Country Scenic Byway system

#### Example of Land Use Changes along the Byways: Intensive Development on NH 16 Between Gorham and Berlin

- Development: The portion of NH 16 between its junction with Route 2 in Gorham and its junction with NH 110 in Berlin is the most developed portion of the North Country Scenic & Cultural Byway system. There are more than 40 commercial or industrial establishments along this fivemile stretch of NH 16, most of which is fully developed on one or both sides.
- Scenic & Cultural Resources:
  - Multiple views of the Androscoggin River.
  - Views of mills relate to theme of Woodland Heritage Trail.
  - B&M Railroad bridge.
  - Short sections through forests.

Typical development along NH 16 north of US 2




### Access to Historical Markers in the North Country

- NCC used Google Maps to obtain photos of roadside conditions by 52 historical markers in the North Country
- Access varied greatly:
  - Formal paved parking was available for 10 markers
  - Formal unpaved parking was available for 14 markers
  - Informal unpaved parking was available for 12 markers
  - No parking was available for 16 markers
- The lack of parking not only hinders access to the markers, it creates a safety hazard.

(Located on US 3 where there is a 50 mph speed limit)






### Plans for 2020: Information and Marketing

- Continue working on initiatives to promote and enhance the North Country Regional Scenic Byway System:
  - Better on-line information about the byways, historical markers, and other byway resources.
  - Maps, brochures and rack cars
  - Highlight local tours and local resources
- Coordinate with NCC, federal and state agencies, tourism industry, and others to promote the North Country Regional Scenic Byway System.

### Plans for 2020: Byway Infrastructure

- Continue working on initiatives to enhance the North Country Regional Scenic Byway System:
  - Identify locations where infrastructure investments would be most beneficial.
  - Seek long-term funding for assisting municipalities willing to invest in pull-offs and other byway improvements.
  - Seek funding to provide safe access to all historical markers located on North Country Byways.
- Coordinate with NCC, federal and state agencies, tourism industry, and others to promote investment in the byways.

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## Plans for 2020: Route Structure & Stewardship

- Recommendations to NH SBC:
  - Obtain approval of route change applications submitted to NH SBC.
- Stewardship:
  - Identify specific locations that should be considered for potential investments in pulloffs, rest areas, trail heads, and other byway amenities.
  - Seek ways to enhance access to and to improve the conditions for visitors stopping to read historical markers.
