Electrify all transportation:

EV charging infrastructure

- Access to variety of clean fuel options (don't pick fuels, flexible) Also helps resiliency
- EV rebates
- Rebates to companies who put in EV charging


2 Rounds of Conversation on Two Questions

Listening for emerging possibilities

- We are fully present without preconceptions or judging
- Acknowledge what is feel with the person
- Notice the impulse or energy that moves and/or the insight or new idea that "drops in"






Listening with warmth and curiosity.

Attunement is the experience of someone focusing on us with warmth, respect and curiosity. This person wonders what it is like to be us, using all of their senses to tune into us.





Resonance is what happens when we have a sense that the other person really gets us....it calms us the most.

The mindset and orientation of the listener




- "You matter"

- I know you have answers within you


